

**Minutes of 37th Annual Meeting
Southern Poultry Science Society
January 26, 2016**

I. With ~80 members present, President David Caldwell called the meeting to order. The first order of business was the reading of the minutes from the previous meeting on January 27, 2015. It was moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes; the motion was seconded and passed with no discussion or dissenting votes.

II. Executive Secretary, Mary Beck, presented the financial report for the 2014-2015 fiscal year (Attachment 1).

The 2014-2015 Financial Report was reviewed. The beginning balance in all three accounts was \$103,281.08; the ending balance was \$113,196.83. Sponsor donations for the 2015 meeting were \$30,500. The net balance of the society increased by \$9,915.75 during the annual period of this report.

It was moved that the report be accepted as presented. The motion was seconded and passed with no discussion or dissenting votes.

III. Bob Buresh, Chair of the Audit Committee, presented the report of the Audit Committee. (Attachment 2). The committee offered special thanks to the sponsors for their support during these tough economic times.

It was moved that the report of the audit committee be accepted. The motion was seconded and passed with no discussion or dissenting votes.

IV. President Caldwell presented the Resolutions Report (Attachment 3), with a different format this year; the report was distributed at the door as members entered and only the resolutions of remembrance were read with a moment of silence following.

It was moved that the report be accepted as distributed. The motion was seconded and passed with no discussion or dissenting votes.

V. The Program Report was presented by 2nd VP Edgar Oviedo (Appendix 4). There were 366 abstracts and 1651 attendees. Metabolism and Nutrition had the most abstracts with close to 90; followed by Environment Management with close to 40, SCAD with ~22, Processing & Products with 18, Pathology with ~12, and Physiology with ~10.

It was moved that the report be accepted as presented. The motion was seconded and passed with no discussion or dissenting votes.

- VI. First Vice President, David Caldwell, expressed his appreciation to the judges and presented the student awards. Each student received a certificate and check for \$500; each session chair and judge received a \$50 gift certificate
